Week 1 Spring Term!
Welcome back! It has been so lovely to see you all back in school. I hope you had a lovely Christmas break and thank you all so much for the gifts you gave us at Christmas, they really are so very much appreciated. It's been a bit chilly this week! The Weather forecast is looking a little warmer next week, but please make sure that your children are suitably dressed

I'm sure you will join me in welcoming Miss Voong, Mrs Davies, Mrs Radford and Mrs Goddard who have joined our staff team this term and we welcome back Mrs Lockrose who is teaching in Year 1 until further notice. Unfortunately Ms Mitchell has decided to withdraw from the process so we are advertising again to replace her. We also look forward to welcoming Mrs Corry, our new SENCo after Easter. Mrs McMillan, our HSLW, will be acting SENCo until she joins us

We have had a busy start to the week with the Police visiting us on Wednesday, to talk to our Year 5 and 6 children about online safety. The children have also enjoyed starting their new topics this week. The new topic webs should be on the website for your information early next week.

Year R have been enjoying the story of the gingerbread man! There was a 'crime scene' in wren's class room earlier on this week and the children have collected clues to find out what had happened to the gingerbread man, who had bitten off his leg and they created wanted posters to try and find out. (Clues seem to suggest the fox might have had something to do with this?!)

In Year 1 the children have enjoyed the story of Emma Jane's Aeroplane. They have been learning about continents, capital cities and the four nations of the UK in geography. They have also been counting backwards and forwards to and from 20 in maths as well as investigating their number bonds to 10.

Our Year 2 children have been writing riddles about African animals. They have finished off their shape topic in maths, learning about properties of 3D shapes and investigating patterns as well as starting their new topic on Money. In PE they have started exploring African Dance and in art they have been looking at African masks, reviewing and evaluating them in preparation for designing and making their own.

Year 3 have had their first forest school session, making ice sculptures. They have started two exciting books in Literacy and the children have been writing some excellent sentences using conjunctions and adverbs. Their maths topic continues to be multiplication and the children have been multiplying 2 digit numbers by one digit brilliantly! In science they have started to learn about skeletons, in R E about Sikhism and they have created timelines in history for the Ancient Egyptians! What a busy week!

Year 4 have also started lots of new topics. In Science they are learning about teeth this term and used a mirror to look the different types of teeth! In History they have started their Anglo-Saxon topic and the book they are using in English links to this as well. This afternoon, they started to make Anglo-Saxon jewellery and in computing the children are learning to programme, using logo turtle software. This week they programmed it to draw shapes.

Year 5 have started their new topic of life in The Freezer! They have been learning about Shackleton's expedition to the Antarctic and have written letters applying for jobs on his ship. In computing they have been using Micro-Bit Processors and in Maths they have been perfecting long multiplication!

Our Year 6 children have now finished writing their discussion text from last term on whether xenotransplantation should be allowed. They have also started their new topic on the Identity Project. They have been learning about electricity in science and have tackled multiplying and diving fractions by integers in maths!

Our attendance award went to Year 5 again this week with 97.5%. Well done Hawks! As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Mrs McMillan is in the process of contacting the parents of children who's attendance is beginning to cause some concern. Please be aware that I cannot authorise family holidays. As much as we recognise the importance of family time together and the expense of holidays during scheduled breaks, every minute in school really does count!

A couple of reminders before I close. My usual parking reminder—please be condsiderate! Also please remember the deadline for applying for reception places, close next Wednesday 15 January 2025.

Forest Learning, Forest Fun and Welly Wednesday!






