### Another week gone by!

I'd like to start this week by thanking the FROTH both for the Quiz night, which I thoroughly enjoyed (even though the teachers team didn't win!) and for their AGM meeting last Sunday. We are hugely appreciative of everything the FROTH team does for our school and it was lovely to be able to share the successes and future ideas the team has had. The next events to look forward to the Disco, Glow run, pyjama day and crazy hair day! (More details will no doubt follow!)

Thank you also to everyone who supported our Harvest festival this week. I have included some photos late in the newsletter. It is always lovely to see our children in our local church and I was very proud of the prayers, artwork and singing the children produced!

I'm having a little bit of a focus on uniform at the moment, especially school shoes, not trainers and girls wearing leggings instead of school trousers or skirts. Please can you take a moment to check that uniform is still correct? If there are any problems we are always happy to help.

This week learning wise our Year R children used instruments to make a trap for the troll as part of their enjoyment of the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff! They have also been thinking about the special people in their families and have been exploring our Harvest theme in their own environment.

Year 1 have been learning about seasons and how they change. They have also been using number bonds to 10 and enjoying the story of 'The Leaf Thief'.

Our year 2 have challenged themselves in Science and thought about the best design to use to make a paper bridge for Tom Thumb to drive his car along. In maths they practised counting in twos, fives, tens and threes. In English the children loved using highlighters to identify the features of a diary! The children enjoyed debating about who was to blame for the Fire of London, and apparently most people blamed the Mayor and the baker!

Year 3 have had a busy week writing instructions, using time conjunctions and adverbs. They have been learning how to bridge to the nearest ten or hundred when adding on a number line in maths and are working on adding ten mentally to any 3 digit number. They have also researched Skara Brae, the ancient Stone Age Settlement, in History.

It's been another busy week in Falcons this week. In English they have started reading the story of Romulus and Remus. In Maths they have been looking at formal methods of addition and subtraction and in history they have drawn plans of Roman towns. In PSHE they talked about different feelings and described how people might look and feel when they are happy, sad, angry or calm.

Year 5 have been thinking about Ancient Greek Gods this week, researching their characteristics and bullet pointing key facts about them. In Maths they have been looking at missing number problems and in History they have learnt about the Olympic games, comparing the modern day with the Ancient Greek Olympics.

Our Year 6 have been looking at narrative poetry in English and long multiplication and division in Maths. They have also been pulling together our 'Holme's Got Talent' show. It is a shame is has had to be postponed but we look forward to seeing every one in action in due course!

Our attendance award went to Year 1 again this week with 98.6%. Well done Robins! As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Please be aware that I cannot authorise family holidays. As much as we recognise the importance of family time together and the expense of holidays during scheduled breaks, every minute in school really does count!






