Dear Parents and Carers.

Another week gone by!

Wow! What a busy week! I'd like to start this week by saying a big thank you to 'Auntie Kirsty' and Mrs Hoe for arranging for the author Louie Stowell to come to our school. The children thoroughly enjoyed hearing about her books and learning about life as an author.

I would also like to say another big thank you to our FROTH team for organising our social event this evening. I think a good time was had by all and I certainly enjoyed it.

Our year 5 children have had their play leader training today. Again the children seemed to enjoy the session and I look forward to seeing them in action next week!

Elsewhere around school the Year R children have had their first full week in school. They are really starting to find their feet and settling in well. They enjoyed the story of The Three Little Pigs and making houses for the pigs. It is really lovely to see them enjoying their learning environment.

In Year 1 the children have been investigating one more and one less in Maths. In English they used instruments to make the sounds that the wind and sun made as Miss Maidens read the fable The North Wind and Sun to them. They have learnt about weather forecasting and pretended to be weather reporters. They have been Mark making in Art, exploring lots of different ways to create different lines and they have also explored more ways to jump and learnt special skills to do this in PE. What a busy week!

Year 2 have been investigating The Great Fire of London this week, thinking about why the fire spread so quickly and how they tried to put it out. They have been retelling the story of Billy and the Beast in English and learning about place value and bar modelling in Maths.

Year 3 have been using direct speech and speech punctuation in their writing this week. In Maths they have been estimating numbers on a number-line and comparing numbers. In History the children have been looking at Artefacts from Star Carr—investigating what they tell us about the Mesolithic period. They have also been using their History focus to create cave paintings in Art!

In Year 4 the children have continued to investigate states of matter in Science, this week they have been testing different makes of ketchup! They have been thinking about character description in English and have continued to explore number and place value in Maths. In History they have been investigating how Claudius invaded Britain and used the Roman theme in their writing and guided reading! This afternoon some of the children have begun to make a Roman Bulla.

As well as their play leader training this morning our Year 5 children have been improving their handball skills in PE. They have become 'History Detectives' looking for clues from artefacts. They have learnt about Medusa and written character descriptions in English as well as adding colour using chalk pastels to their Greek pots from last week.

Our Year 6 children have enjoyed 'Goodnight Mr Tom' comparing the book and the film. They have been writing missing person reports for Suki, a character from 'Letters from the Lighthouse.' They have been working with numbers up to a million, looking at place value and comparing number.

Our attendance award went to Year 4 with 97.8% this week. Well done Falcons! As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Please be aware that I cannot authorise family holidays. As much as we recognise the importance of family time together and the expense of holidays during scheduled breaks, every minute in school really does count!


