### Week 3 Autumn Term 2!

The weeks seem to be flying by!

I would like to start this week by thanking our FROTH team again. I know that everyone who took part in our glow run last week thoroughly enjoyed themselves and we welcomed two of the 'team' into our assembly this morning to give out certificates and prizes to children who raised extra money through sponsorship. Thank you again to everyone who supported the event.

Talking of visitors to the school, Year 5 and 6 welcomed the author Ally Sherrick into school today. She wrote the book 'Black Powder' which is currently being enjoyed by Hawks as their class text and part of their topic this term. Our KS2 children also had a visit from the SCARF team this week as part of their PSHE programme of study.

A couple of reminders. There are still one or two children coming into school without coats! With the cold and wet spells we are experiencing at the moment, it really is so important that our children are dressed appropriately. Also with the cold wet weather there are naturally more traffic in the mornings, please, please be patient and park considerately. We have had another 'near miss' this morning so please can everyone be extra careful.

Healthy food! As you know we really do encourage the children to eat healthily. I have noticed one or two KS2 children eating crisps and chocolate bars as part of their break time snack. Please can I remind you that playtime snacks should be a healthy snack, preferably fruit and that packed lunches should not contain sweets or chocolate bars. (chocolate coated biscuits from the biscuit sides are first though.)

I was incredibly proud of our Year 4 children's class assembly on this afternoon! Thank you to all the parents who were able to come and support your children—it was really lovely to see them celebrate their learning this term. We have Year 5's class coming up in December and once Miss Rose has fully recovered from her 'minor op,' I'm sure we will be putting in a date for our Year 6 assembly

Learning wise this week, our Year R children have been enjoying their dinosaur topic this again week. They have been looking at dinosaur eggs, finding out about eggs hatching and they have even had a go at dinosaur yoga. Their maths and phonics skills are coming along beautifully as well!

In Year 1 the children have been finding patterns in maths. They have also been innovating a story, making it their own in English and investigating materials in science.

Our Year 2 children have been problem solvers and team players in Maths. They have been subtracting crossing the tens boundary and solving problems this week, they have also had a lovely time looking at the compass points in geography to navigate around the landmarks in London as well as creating flags and models to celebrate London. The children have also finished some super writing about "Katie going to London!"

Year 3 have also had an incredibly busy week. They have had a go at some written maths assessments before the end of term tests. Afterwards looking at where some of the common mistakes were made and reminding themselves about the column method. They have been planning and writing autobiographies as well as starting a new geography topic about Europe. They had an interesting discussion about similarities and differences between countries. They have also learnt about Jewish weddings in RE and the promises that are made during the ceremony.

As well pulling together their class assembly, Year 4 have been learning the 3x and 6x tables and in English we have continued with their writing about The Tin Forest. In Science, They investigated circuits and managed to create a circuit and light up the bulb. It was very exciting!

I saw some lovely writing in Year 5 this week. The children have been using prepositional starters for their sentences and are so inspired by their topic this term. They enjoyed listening to the author who commented on how thoughtful their questions were.

Our Year 6 children wished Miss Rose well and welcomed Ms Lockrose into the classroom this week. Ms Lockrose will be teaching in Year 6 whilst Miss Rose is recovering from her minor operation. They too enjoyed the author visit and have also been using a range of sentences in their writing. They are enjoying their class text, 'Pig Heart Boy' and have been tackling fractions again in Maths.

As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Our attendance award went to Year 5 this week with 97.4%. Well done Hawks! (Hawks also won our 'Quiet as a Mouse' award for walking around the school sensibly.)






