Dear Parents and Carers,

Another week gone by!

Well—that was September! It's definitely getting colder. Please can I start by reminding you that children really do need to bring coats to school at this time of year and I'd also like to put out a plea for donations of tissue boxes. The children seem to getting through tissues at a rate of knots!

FROTH have asked me to remind you about a couple of events coming up. We have the Quiz night next Friday and the AGM on Sunday 6th September. I have included information fliers on both of these events later on in this newsletter.

It's been a bit of a quieter week in school. Our Play leaders have been putting their training to good use supporting our younger children at lunchtime. We announced our Year 6 house captains and sports captains this morning. It was a very difficult decision to make as all the children's applications were superb! Talking of our Year 6 children, they have been proactive in pulling together our Harvest Charity fundraiser initiative and some of our children have been auditioning this afternoon for 'The Holme's Got Talent.' More details will be coming your way!

Learning wise our I saw our Year R children having a lovely PE lesson today! They were ball rolling, running and stopping! They even managed to include some counting into their activities. They have been enjoying the story of 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears' this week. The children have been re-telling the story to each other using toys and making pictures of the three bears out of the Autumn leaves they found in the forest.

Mrs Hotchkiss has been particularly impressed by the Year 1 writing today. The children became 'authors' for the morning, wrote a whole story and enjoyed reading their stories to other children across our school! As well as fantastic writing, in Maths the children have been learning about number lines and drawing their own number lines outside in the garden area with chalk, and experimenting with rubbings using pencils, cravons and chalk in Art.

Following on from their enjoyment of their class text Billy and the Beast, our Year 2 children have been designing their own beasts and will by writing character descriptions of their own beast in order to modify the story. In Maths they have been estimating on a number line and in Science they have been sorting man made and natural materials. They have also been busily designing a fire engine as part of their DT topic.

Year 3 have been writing stone age diary entries this week in English. They have been ordering numbers and counting in 50s in Maths. In Science they have been investigating shadows and looking at the invention of farming as part of their Stone Age History topic! They have also produced some fantastic Stone Age hand prints in Art.

In Year 4 the children have enjoyed learning about Roman Soldiers in History and have used the information they have found out about the fort at Vindolanda to write letters from a Roman Soldier. In Maths they have been rounding numbers to 100 and 1000 and been working hard on their times tables. In Science they have been writing up and evaluating their Ketchup experiment from last week and in Art this afternoon the children have made some super 'pop-up colosseum cards.

Year 5 have also been ordering and rounding number. They have been working with numbers up to a million! They have been writing, editing and improving their Perseus and Medusa character descriptions in English and learning about why Athens was such a strong city and the Battle of Marathon in History. I also saw a fantastic music lesson yesterday—the children were thoroughly enjoying using the glockenspiels!

Our Year 6 have been working with number as well in Maths. The children have been working on Arithmetic, rounding and ordering larger numbers and looking at longer word problems. In English the children have been editing, improving and publishing their missing person reports based on 'Letters from the Lighthouse' from last week and have begun to plan their diary entries ready to write next week. They have also started their WWII propaganda posters in Art!

Our attendance award went to Year 3 with 98.8% this week. Well done Woodpeckers! As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Please be aware that I cannot authorise family holidays. As much as we recognise the importance of family time together and the expense of holidays during scheduled breaks, every minute in school really does count!

Another reminder form about the dates for applications to secondary and reception places for September '25. I have included a poster with information on applying for reception places. The deadlines for applications are as follows: Secondary school places:—the application process opened on Monday 9th September and closes at midday 31st October. (The application forms are on Hampshire County Council website, 'apply for a school place.' For Reception places, applications open on Friday 1 November 2024 and close on Wednesday 15 January 2025.
