

5th and12th July - Year 6

Ideally the children should wear the following as a minimum, although this week has been very warm in the forest:

- · Vest
- $\cdot$  Short or long sleeved tee shirt
- · Jumper or fleece (1 or 2 thinner ones work well)
- · A hat which will fit under a hood
- · Gloves or mittens which may be worn when required
- · 2 pairs of socks
- · Jogging bottoms

As we are approaching the Autumn/Winter months and the forest can be very cold and wet, please ensure that your child has several layers of clothing on with a change of socks. The children should come to school in their forest school clothes and can stay in them for the whole day. Please make sure though that they do have a change of socks and dry shoes or boots. If you have your own waterproofs from home then please do wear them however the school have a supply for you to wear!

## From the Headley Voluntary Care Group

We are also working on an updated document regarding the desperate need we have for slightly younger members of the local community to think about becoming drivers of patients to medical appointments. This document could allay the doubts of possible drivers regarding insurance, reimbursement, (mileage/petrol money) or the level of commitment required of volunteers, who are able to choose their level of involvement. Given the lack of public transport and the high cost of taxis in the area, there is no affordable way for many of these patients to get to their appointments. Furthermore, due to the increasing age of many of our present drivers, there is a danger that the ability to provide this **essential** service may die out.

We would be very grateful if you could help us to raise awareness of our need for drivers among the school community and their wider connections in our local area.






