Week 4 Autumn Term 2!

Another busy week here at The Holme!

Just like last week I would like to start by thanking our fantastic FROTH team again, this time for the dance and games evening. I know that the children thoroughly enjoyed themselves and I had a little bit of a boogie as well! Also a big thank you to Mr West for providing the music.

Talking of music, on Tuesday, we were so pleased to welcome back The Music Works who led a rocking assembly in the afternoon that had the whole school singing and dancing to songs by Harry Styles, Taylor Swift and the Killers to name but a few! Even the teachers were having a boogie! Some of the more long-standing parents might remember that The Music Works used to provide peripatetic Ukelele lessons at the school before Covid and we are in discussion with them as to how we can bring this back to the Holme in 2025. Learning wise this week, our Year R children have been the children have continued their dinosaur investigations, hatching eggs and finding words to do with dinosaurs! They have been counting to 5 in Maths, subitising, taking away and noticing differences.

In Year 1 the children have carried on investigating patterns in maths. They have also been writing some super diary entries in English as well as really trying hard with their handwriting and presentation. In their topic time they have been finding out all about the history of toys.

Our Year 2 children have been finding the missing numbers in maths. They wrote about Katie visiting Bordon, she especially liked going to The Shed and The Holme. In science they looked at different types of seeds and they have been making Christmas crafts for FROTH. They have also really enjoyed practising the Christmas Nativity.

Year 3 have also had an incredibly busy week. They have been writing descriptive settings for The BFG in English, focusing on their 3 times tables in Maths, Learning about the Passover festival in RE and learning all about healthy eating in Science. They have also produced some amazing aminations in computing.

Year 4 have been using nouns, verbs and adjectives to create a word banks t help them plan their setting descriptions based on Tin Forest. They have been really focusing on their 3,6 and 9 times tables in Math, finding out how they relate to each other. In Science they have continued making circuits and drawing diagrams in their books and in Geography they have been learning about compass points and using them in their map work.

Year 5 have produced some really high quality diary entries this week, based on their book Black Powder. It's clear that we were all inspired by Ally Sherrick's visit last week! They have also been tackling some of the more tricky fractions learning in Year 5, adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators. They have begun to think more about Islam in RE. In history they are continuing our journey through English history looking at William the Conqueror and King John and thinking about how much power they had in preparation for their trip to Windsor next week and in Science they have continued to learn about plants.

Our Year 6 children have been writing the narrative based on Alma and Ms Lockrose has been son impressed with the quality of their work. In Maths they have been continuing their work on fractions, this week looking at adding and subtracting mixed number and improper fractions. Their topic work this term is Geography based and they have been learning about the United Kingdom, focussing on the nations of the UK and counties.

As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Our attendance award went to Year 3 and 6 this week, this week, both with 94.8%.








WOODLAND WARRIORS DAY CAMP
