Dear Parents and Carers,

Another week gone by!

Thank you to everyone who has donated tissues—we have definitely needed them this week as we seem to have hit 'cold' season!

Thank you to everyone who is supporting the quiz night this evening—I am really looking forward to seeing you later! Thank you to our lovely FROTH team for organising the event. I am also looking forward to seeing some of you at the FROTH AGM here at school on Sunday (7-9pm—everyone is welcome.)

I was incredibly proud of our handball team! 16 of our children represented our school in the Oakmoor championship. They played brilliantly and our Year 5 and 6 team came 2nd! Well done and thank you to everyone involved.

Another fairly quiet week in school this week. The children have been preparing for Harvest and of course practising for our talent show

This week our Year R children having been enjoying the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff! The children have been creative, making their own trolls out of play-dough and they have been retelling the story, thinking about how unkind the troll was.

Year I have been learning about Poems. They have been practising saying poetry out loud and performed their poem to Year 5. They have also been painting their own Autumn leaves and cutting out leaves to make a tree.

Our year 2 children's science this week has been particularly fun! They made playdough and thought about how we can change materials using force. They also wrote recipes for some particularly awful beasty soup in English, this really inspired the children to think creatively. In history they found out how London changed after the great fire and Miss Dunwoodie has been very impressed by how many facts the children can remember!

Year 3 have been thinking about how to wash a woolly mammoth and have used time conjunctions and adverbs in English to write instructions. In Maths they have been adding and subtracting hundred tens and ones and in Art they have been analysing a picture of a Stone Age hunting scene.

It's been such a busy week in Falcons this week. They have been writing, editing and improving Roman soldier diary entries in English. In maths they learned about Roman numerals and have now started looking at addition and subtraction. In science they have looked at how solids and liquids can change. They experimented to find the best way to melt chocolate and decided that putting in into a bag in a bowl of warm water was the most successful method. In Art, they finished their 'pop up' colosseum cards which look very effective and colourful. They have also been busy writing prayers for our Harvest service in church next Wednesday.

Year 5 had a Ancient Greek Style Debate! They held a thoughtful, fair discussion with brilliant listening, voting on whether they should raise the voting age in Ancient Greece to 30. There were some very strong opinions! They have also created Greek bowls out of clay, using coils, zigzags and long sausages. They are going to let them dry and then paint them. I am looking forward to seeing the finished product next week.

Our Year 6 have been working hard this week editing and improving their writing in English and looking at reasoning questions in maths. They have enjoyed using acrylic paint in Art.

Our attendance award went to Year 1 with 97.7% this week. Well done Robins! As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Please be aware that I cannot authorise family holidays. As much as we recognise the importance of family time together and the expense of holidays during scheduled breaks, every minute in school really does count!




