Week 5 Autumn Term 2!

I was also incredibly proud of our Year 5 and 6 hockey team who also played at Oakmoor School yesterday and came 2nd overall! They played brilliantly and showed superb sportsmanship—well done to all involved. It was a shame we didn't have enough players for the Year 3 and 4 tournament, fingers crossed next time we will be able to field a team!

Thank you to everyone who wore pyjamas today and brought in a pound for FROTH. The children looked 'sleepy today' and as always thank you so much for your support of our school.

Learning wise this week, much of the week has been spent with nativity rehearsals in Years R, 1 and 2 and with assessments in Years 3, 4 and 5!

Our Year R children have been the children have been finishing off their dinosaur investigations, this week looking at dinosaur poo (pretend of course!) to find out what dinosaurs ate. They have also learnt about Mary Anning and her fossils as well as learning about shape in maths.

In Year 1 the children have carried on investigating patterns in maths and started their topic on taking away in maths. They said goodbye to Miss Maidens on Wednesday and have enjoyed the story of 'Old Bear' in English.

Our Year 2 children have been sewing Christmas decorations this morning! They have also finished their stories about Katie going to Bordon in English and have started to learn about 2D shapes and their properties in Maths. In science, they planted seeds to find out the conditions they need to grow healthily. The children have also had a lovely time in geography looking at photographs and deciding whether or not it was London!

Year 3 have been working hard on their assessments. They have been thinking about strange dreams in English, linked to their topic of the BFG. They have impressed Mrs Shanks with their hockey skills in PE and learnt about the Sukkot in RE as part of their topic on Judaism.

Year 4 have really impressed Mrs Ferguson with their focus in assessments this week. The children have also moved onto the 7 times table in maths, they have been learning all about the Mosque in RE as part of their topic on Islam and been investigating electrical insulators and conductors in Science. As well as all of that they have been using 4 and 6 digit grid map references in Geography.

Our Year 6 children now finished, edited and published their narrative writing. They have been looking at fractions on a number line in Maths, coastal and mountain regions in Geography and learning all about prophesy and The Messiah in RE.

As you know attendance is an area we are really keen to improve and we do really need everyone to be attendance 'HERO's at school—Here, Everyday, Ready and On time! Our attendance award went to Year 5 this week, with 98.6% - well done Hawks.






